

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT THE PRESIDENT'S SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

1. Who has been selected for the President's Scholarship Award?

Awards have been made to students who have received a First Class Honours in their Undergraduate Degree or in the Graduate Diploma in Education (Primary Teaching).

2. What Undergraduate Degree programmes are listed as part of the Scheme?

The following Undergraduate Degree programmes have been listed:

- BEd
- BA
- BEd and Psychology
- BA in Early Childhood Care and Education

7. What is the duration of the scholarship?

The duration of the scholarship is the programme registration period which is one or two years for a taught programme and two years for a research programme

8. How many students will be in my class?

Class sizes vary from 10 to 15 students normally.

9. When do modules take place?

Programme co-ordinators and course leaders are best positioned to answer when modules are scheduled for the Taught MA and MEd. Some programmes take place on weekday evenings and others take place at weekends. Lectures are not a feature of the MA by Research.
