Be someone the community trust and know they can count on.

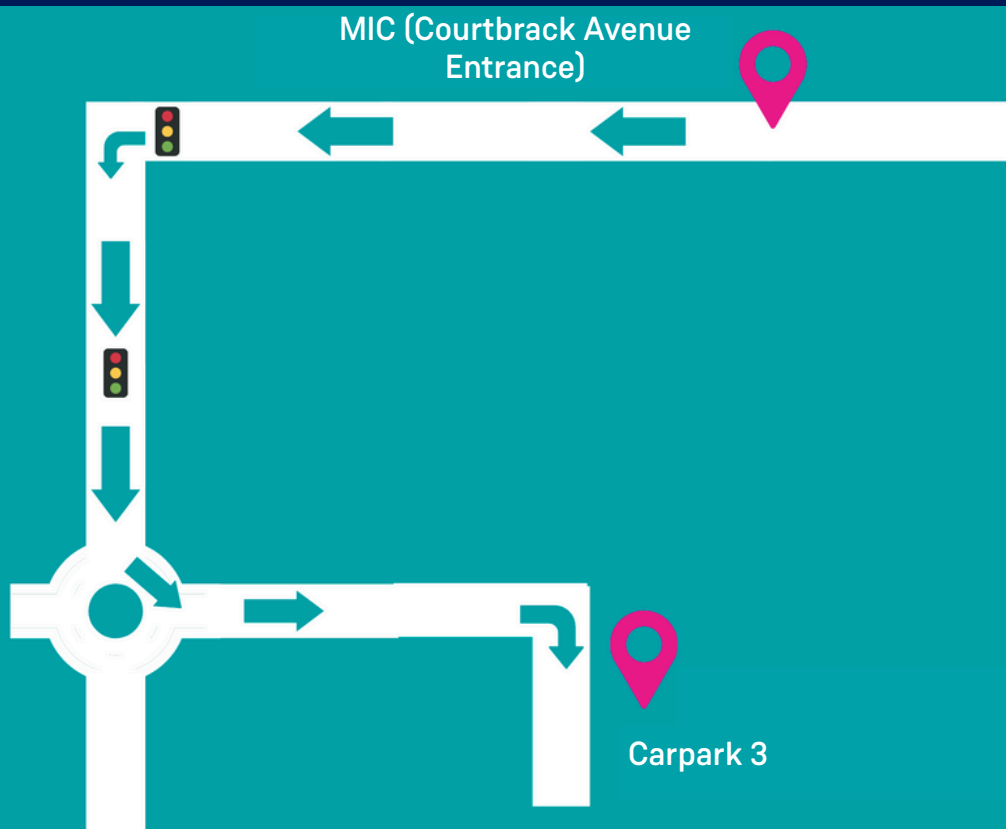
The Park & Ride

Parking is extremely limited both in and around MIC. As a practical step to avoid parking in the wrong areas, please use MIC's free Park & Ride facility.

Buses run hourly to and from Carpark 3, located by the nearby Greyhound track, until 6.15pm throughout the week.

The Park & Ride is completely free for students to use and minimises the chances of missing lectures, getting a parking ticket or being clamped.
