

# Understanding Undergraduate Course Fees

Fees are broadly categorised as;

- **EU** (paid by EU nationals with EU birth certificate or passport)
- **Non-EU** (those who are residents outside the European Union)

Fees are comprised of three elements;

1. **Tuition fees - €2,564**
2. **Student Contribution Charge - €3,000**
3. **College Levies – Varies per course**

## 1. Tuition fee:

This **may** be paid on your behalf by the Irish Government (HEA).

It is **not means tested** and a brief synopsis of eligibility is listed here:

- The student is attending a full time undergraduate course and the course is a minimum of two years duration.
- The student has never been to third level College / University before either here or anywhere else in the EU.
- The student is an Irish national who has lived here for 3 of the past 5 years.
- The student is a national of an EU state who has lived in the EU for 3 of the past 5 years.
- The student has Official Irish Refugee status and has lived in the EU for 3 of the past 5 years. **Visit the HEA website for full eligibility criteria:** <https://hea.ie/funding-governance-performance/funding/student-finance/course-fees/>

## 2. Student contribution charge (SCC)

This is payable by you **or** if you are deemed eligible for a SUSI grant, Mary Immaculate College will invoice SUSI for your SCC.

This SUSI grant is **means tested** and you can apply for this online. **Visit the SUSI website for further information:** [www.susi.ie](http://www.susi.ie)

When completing your online registration with Mary Immaculate College you will be asked if you have applied for a grant and will be required to enter your SUSI application number.

## 3. Student levies: vary per undergraduate course
