Screening & Discussion of Sarah El Hamed's short film: If They Could Have, France Algeria, UK 2025, 5 mins. This short film is an exploration of colonial trauma among women in the former French colonies. Through this film, Sarah explores female resistance and how this is connected to the longer history of female oral tradition in Algeria and North Africa.



Screening & Discussion of Nadja Makhlouf's short film: Between Midnight and Six in the Morning, Algeria, UK, 2024, 4 mins. In 1961, six inmates escaped from the women's prison in central Paris where large numbers of Algerian women fighters were being held. This film unearths the female voices of a resistance movement that unfolded on mainland France amongst Algerian migrants. As such it is part of a wider installation that recovers Algerian female agency and cultural expression including song.



'Songs, Steps and Soda Cakes': a story of intergenerational traditions of transmission in Scoil Uí Ruairc Irish Dance School (est. 1929). Discussion by Orfhlaith & Mairéad Ní Bhriain on the voice of women in the Irish Oral tradition.
