Terms and Conditions

1. Sport Schemes

MIC is offering two types of Sport Schemes:

1.1 Elite Sport Scholarships in memory of Noreen Lynch and Leonard Enright

1.1.1 The value of each scholarship is up to €4,000 to be delivered through a conditional bursary and additional benefits. The value of the bursary is €4,000 (€180 gym, €120 sports clothing & €3,700 towards MIC student debt (fees/accommodation) in the first instance and remainder paid out by bursary). The value of the gym & sport clothing cannot be converted to a monetary award. Successful applicants must meet the Sports Assessment Criteria (see Section 5).

1.1.2 The duration of the Elite Sport Scholarship is for one Academic Year only. However, successful applicants may apply for successive years.

1.1.3 Students in receipt of a Postgraduate Studentship / Assistantship are **ineligible** to apply for the Elite Sport Scholarships.

1.2 CAO Points Concession Sports Scheme

1.2.1 Successful applicants who meet all the necessary entry requirements, and also meet the Sports Assessment Criteria (see Section 5), may be awarded a points reduction of up to 40 points below the Round One CAO points cut-off for their selected programme of study.

2. Application Form

2.1 Applicants are required to complete an online application form available at: www.mic.ie/scholarships (Separate application form for each scheme)

2.2 The closing date for applications is 1 May on the year of application.

3. Application Procedure Elite Sports Scholarships

To be considered for the Elite Sports Scholarships the following procedures apply:

3.1 Incoming Undergraduate Applicants:

3.1.1 Should apply for their programme of choice as normal through the CAO.

3.1.2 Should apply directly to MIC for these scholarships via an online application form, quoting their CAO Number.

3.1.3 Must meet the Sports Assessment Criteria (see Section 5).

3.2 Incoming Postgraduate Applicants and Current MIC Students:

3.2.1 Should apply directly to MIC via the online application form, quoting their quoting their postgraduate application payment reference ID number or MIC student number as applicable.

3.2.2 Must meet the Sports Assessment Criteria (see Section 5).

4. Application Procedure CAO points Concession Scheme

To be considered for this entry scheme, applicants must:

4.1 Have applied for a programme of their choice at MIC through the CAO.

4.2 Meet the minimum entry requirements of their desired Level 8 programme.

4.3 Come within 40 points of Round One CAO points for their nominated programme.

4.4 Apply directly to MIC for these scholarships via an online application form, quoting their CAO number.

5. Sports Assessment Criteria

5.1 The following minimum standards of participation will apply to both schemes:

- Gaelic Games: Minor County level and capable of competing at a higher age level
- Hockey: Interprovincial/International representation
- Athletics: Schools/Celtic Games or Junior international representation
- Rugby: Schools/age grade, international, provincial and/or international representation/provincial academy/Sub-Academy/Overseas or UK equivalent
- Soccer: Schools/age grade international and/or provincial representation/emerging talent programme/Overseas or UK equivalent
- Basketball: Super League Level and/or National Junior squad representation
- Rowing: Junior national representation
- Other Sports: As defined by the recognised sporting body

5.2 Those applying to the Elite Scholarship must clearly demonstrate that they have the potential to, or are already, performing at Adult Inter County level with respect to Gaelic games; Adult International or achieved the highest level of participation within the sport category.

6. Criteria for MIC Sports Schemes

6.1 Applicants may apply for both schemes using the two separate application forms

6.2 All awardees are expected to act as ambassadors for MIC in terms of their participation in their chosen sport **or** other activities as requested by the College for the duration of the scheme.

6.3 All awardees must display at all times an appropriate standard of conduct and sportsmanship. Awardees shall never engage in any activity, which may potentially bring the College into disrepute. MIC retains the right to withdraw the award should the recipient be in breach of the MIC Code of Conduct for Students.

6.4 In the event that the successful applicant(s) is/are injured in the year for which the award is offered, the recipient will be required to complete all ambassadorial duties at a later date.

6.5 The successful applicant(s) is/are expected to attend and represent MIC at a minimum of three promotional events in the year the award is granted.

7. Adjudication Process MIC Sport Schemes

MIC has a dedicated Sports Scholarship Committee who will consider and oversee the application process for both the CAO Concession Scheme and the Elite Sport Scholarships. The decision of the Committee is final. Canvassing will lead to disqualification.

7.1 Adjudication Process CAO Points Concession Sports Scheme

7.1.1 The Committee will review all applications and create a shortlist of suitable applicants for both schemes following the application deadline of 1 May.

7.1.2 All applicants for the CAO Points Concession Sports Scheme shall be notified of the outcome of their application as soon as practicable after the CAO Round One Offers are made.

7.2 Adjudication Process Elite Sport Scholarships

7.2.1 The Committee will review all applications and create a shortlist of suitable applicants who will be invited for interview following the application deadline of 1 May.

7.2.2 Interviews for the Elite Sport Scholarships will take place in mid-July.

7.2.3 A letter of offer will be forwarded to successful applicants of the Elite Sport Scholarships following the interviews.
